

DIRECTOR'S NOTES – Dan Gibbins

Here's the thing. Batman and Superman didn't stop fighting because their mothers have the same name. No, it made Batman see Superman as just a guy concerned about his human mother, not an alien monster needing to be put down. And beyond that, the name Martha had come to represent everything good about Batman, everything he was afraid (rightfully) he'd lost. So to hear that name right before he's about to straight up murder a good man...

(I'm kidding, I'm kidding, don't use that.)

Just an old fashioned Love Song, coming on the radio...

It's been nearly two years since Aaron first showed me *Love Song*. He pulled out his copy of the script, grabbed two of my *Frost/Nixon* cast, and they read the second scene right there at the Scorpio bar. Already it looked like something I wanted to be a part of. When I saw the whole script, I knew I HAD to be part of it.

This is a show about love, about loneliness, about a man beginning to live instead of simply existing. And that's an amazing and beautiful thing to see, enough so that it transforms everyone around him. And it's been an amazing thing to help shape, to bring to life.

Molly reinvigorates Beane. These past six weeks, *Love Song* has been my Molly. And now it can be yours. So sit back and get ready to fall in love with *Love Song*.

ASSISTANT DIRECTOR'S NOTES – Nathan Iles

"Have you ever fallen in love with someone you shouldn't have fallen in love with?"

I've never really been one for love songs. Or at least I thought I wasn't. But those words by UK punk band The Buzzcocks have bounced back and forth throughout my brain and heart for almost ten years now, and as I've learned through the amazing process of this production, a love song doesn't always mean something positive. Or negative. It's something more, something more complicated and messy and hard to explain then that black and white dichotomy. "Do you know any songs off by heart?" This play -and as a result, this amazing cast and crew you are about to share a theatre with- ask you that question. Do any songs haunt your soul, the syllables screaming in your head every day? We want you to relive that experience. We want you to hear that music, maybe for the first time ever. And we want you to fall for the *Love Song* all over again.

IT CAME FROM MARS!


October 7-15, 2016




ZASTROZZI: THE MASTER OF DISCIPLINE
