DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I first directed The Affections of May 26 years ago in Red Deer, and always hoped to see another production of it one day. But unlike many of Norm Foster's plays, this one seems to be a rarely produced. When our first two planned productions for the fall each fell through (one will be done next fall, the other is being developed into a TV series for Crave), I suggested this play to our planned director and they were excited to be directing this one, until they were offered a professional theatre job the day prior to auditions. I stepped into the director's shoes, but knew I needed a great co-director, because I was heading to Vancouver to perform in the Fringe Festival in under two weeks. Fortunately, Nicole had contacted Scorpio to be considered for a future season, and when I called her that night, she immediately said yes!

To say that was a lucky turn of events is only the beginning of our journey with this play. We were blessed with an absolutely stacked slate of auditioners, and we ended up with what I can only describe as a dream cast. Throughout a very short rehearsal period they worked their tails off and maintained a wonderfully positive and collaborative attitude. The same goes for the entire production team. We were truly blessed.

Many thanks to each and every person on and off stage who have contributed to making this show one I am very proud of. And my best wishes to my dear friend Paul for a speedy recovery from a serious health scare that landed him in the hospital two days before we moved into the theatre.
